





'As The Fair Turns'

Walworth County Fair to wrap up summer

The 176th annual Walworth County Fair will be at the county fairgrounds, 411 E. Court St., Elkhorn, from Wednesday, Aug.27, through Labor Day, Sept. 1.

During the fair, the grounds will be open from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Wednesday through Sunday, and 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday. The fair office hours are 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. during the fair.

The County Fair celebrates the area's youth and agriculture with numerous contests, animal shows and projects.

This family-friendly event attracts large crowds during its six-day run, offering people of all ages – from kids to the young-at-heart great food, fun rides, interesting displays, live music and more.

The 2024 Fairest of the Fair is Kloie Potts and Fair Royalty is Leslie Reinke. The 2026 Fairest will be crowned during this year's fair.

A few highlights

Sensory friendly time – being sponsored through a partnership between the Walworth County Fair Association and North American Midway, it allows kids and adults between the ages of 3 and 21 who have special needs (and are county residents or attend a school in the county) special time to enjoy the fair.

On Friday, Aug. 29, between the hours of 10 a.m. and noon, the carnival will shut down the flashing lights and music. Additionally, ride staff take extra time and care loading rides and a guardian or caregiver is allowed to ride along.

Register by Aug. 25 but note that space is limited, so the deadline may be moved up. Check the fair website for details.

Golden Vanilla Cupcake Challenge sponsored by King Arthur Baking Company, this event, slated for Sunday, Aug. 31 in North Hall, does not require pre-registration and offers two categories, youth and adult.

Open to all, bake your favorite cupcake recipe using King Arthur Baking Company flour. Bring six cupcakes in or on a disposable container. Include the recipe, your name and phone number (on back) and attach the King Arthur flour UPC code.

Cupcakes need to be in place by 2:45 p.m., judging will begin at 3 p.m. Criteria for judging will be: taste, 50 points; overall taste

Plein Air at the Fair – Fairgoers can see participating artists create art inspired by and created solely at the Walworth County Fair throughout the grounds on Thursday, Aug. 28.

Judging of Plein Air entries will be at 5:30 p.m., Friday, Aug. 29 in the Cultural Arts Building.

Barnyard Adventure – The awardwinning area remains proud to emphasize the diversity of agriculture with numerous learning stations including Crops, Gardening, Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Poultry, Bees, Butterflies and more.

Visit with incredibly knowledgeable beekeepers and butterfly experts, take part in free activities, and view their displays, including an enclosed working beehive and Monarch hatching presentation.

Also in the Barnyard Adventure area, don't miss the Learning Coop Tent, The Barnyard Bin, Nana & Bubba's Pond and the Adventure Stage (which features Nick's Kids Show, Nick's Barnyard Adventure Show, Magic Mike the Magician and a variety of contests.

Topics and activities will include: freshly picked food tastings, story time events, a variety of make and takes for kids and/or adults, butterfly releases (daily at 5 p.m.), freshwater vs. saltwater aquarium care, beekeeping, gardening in the fall, a paint pour, pumpkin/watermelon carving, wood turning, honey, pottery, stained glass, water bath canning and more.



A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FAIR

The Constitution of the Walworth County Agricultural Society was adopted April 28, 1842.

The first annual fair and cattle show that the society has any record was held in the Village of East Troy on Oct. 16, 1850. A total of 35 first premiums, 17 seconds and three thirds were given at that time.

The first County Fair held in Elkhorn was in 1851, and again in 1852, in the block southwest of the City Park. In 1853 the fair site was moved to Delavan but returned





'Sale of Champions' highlights county fair

The Walworth County Fair highlights the achievements of young people in their many talents, including crafts, arts, and photography. There was no better example than the Meat Animal Sale on Aug. 30, 2024 in the Wiswell Center that featured the auction of more than 400 livestock.

Additional auctions during the Fair also included poultry and rabbits.

The "Sale of Champions" includes Grand Champion, Reserve Grand

Champion, Grand Champion Carcass, and Reserve Grand Champion Carcass beef, lambs (listed as wethers) and swine (listed as barrows).

Lainey Popp, who was a junior at the time at Platteville High School, proudly showed her 159-pound Hampshire lamb, which was purchased by Kunes RV for \$10 a pound.

Popp, who transferred from the Walworth 4-H to the Richmond 4-H last year, described the challenge of "having confidence in the ring and not overworking

myself," increased even more due to "high expectations from my family and everybody I show with."

Admitting that her lamb was "really not looking the part for going to the County Fair as he matured," she was pleasantly surprised that he was "looking really good" the week before the big event.

"We walked into the fair thinking he was only going to get fifth in class," she said last fall, and described it as "a big surprise for all of us" that he was judged to be the Grand Champion.

Asked for her advice to others to raise champion livestock successfully, Popp pointed to the importance of having a regular, basic, daily routine with sheep that includes feeding, working their leg hair and developing showmanship skills.

"It helps the sheep to be ready for shows themselves and helps you as a person and showman to be successful," she added.

For Popp, a valuable life lesson that she's learned in and out of the ring includes "always being happy for one another even if you don't win, and always being happy for the person who did win."

She said sportsmanship is a huge thing she's learned.

"It's something that everyone struggles with because obviously everyone wants to win but not everyone can win," Popp said.

Also included in the sale of champion market lambs were Wyatt Nixon (Richmond 4-H) for Reserve Grand Champion, Thomas Sorg (Delavan-Darien High School FFA) for Grand Champion Carcass and Alice LaBadie (Spring Prairie 4-H) for Reserve Grand Champion Carcass.

This year's Grand Champion Swine recognition went to Jacob Dutton, a 2023 graduate of Delavan-Darien High School and a member of the Ridge Prairie 4-H Club.

The auction for Dutton's 286-pound Crossbred swine was won by Conserve FS-Zenda for \$21 per pound.

Billy Johnson, Conserve-FS local crop specialist, said, "We feel the youth livestock projects are invaluable for raising the next generation of ag. We recognize the

amount of commitment and responsibility it requires, often at the expense of giving up much of their summer.'

For Dutton, a challenge in raising his swine was "just learning how to feed it the right feed and getting it broke to walk." Lifelong lessons for Dutton included, "teaching you to take care of something

other than yourself," and he added that, "you get what you put into your project, and I feel life is the same way.

Dutton is an employee in the Grain Division of The Scharine Group, and Marcus Scharine from the company paid Dutton his due.

"His hard work and dedication have really paid off, and we are proud to have him as an employee, as he gives this type of effort each and every day," he said.

Also taking to the ring for the sale of champion market swine were Landon Rehberg (Spring Prairie 4-H) for Reserve Grand Champion, Addison Babcock (Springfield 4-H) for Grand Champion Carcass, and Katrina Kilpin (Elkhorn Area High School FFA) for Reserve Grand Champion Carcass.

Rounding out the champions this year, Rehberg's 1,412-pound steer that came from Indiana captured a \$72 per pound bid by Ted Grant Farms and Southern Lakes

Plumbing and Heating.

No stranger to the world of grand champion livestock, Rehberg's efforts have resulted in past Walworth County Fair awards. This year, his crossbred swine captured the Reserve Grand Champion Swine spot.

Rehberg graduated from Elkhorn Area High School in 2024 and has been a member of the Spring Prairie 4-H club since third grade.


"The biggest challenge I had this year," Rehberg said last fall, "was working on three different steers and having to ensure they all were worked to the best of my ability. The biggest surprise I had this year was being able to sell two of my steers at the Wisconsin State Fair in the Governor's Blue Ribbon Livestock Auction."

Rehberg has shown livestock at the Wisconsin State Fair as well as at the Walworth County Fair. He said the procedures at the Walworth County Fair are identical to those at the Wisconsin State Fair, an indication that the Walworth County Fair's standards are very high.

'One big piece of advice I have for the younger exhibitors is to ask people for advice on how to improve your skills that are a level above you or where you want to be," Rehberg said. "The thing that I have learned during this project that will be valuable is discipline. Without discipline, you will not be able to stay focused on the end goal."

Rehberg is attending Iowa State University and majoring in agricultural engineering.

seemingly no time at all to change the face of country music.

Alabama is the band that changed everything. They reeled off 21 straight #1 singles, a record that will probably never be equaled in any genre.

They brought youthful energy, sex appeal and a rocking edge that broadened country's audience and opened the door to self-contained bands from then on, and they undertook a journey that led, 73 million albums later, to the Country Music Hall of Fame and the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

Warrant has been headlining festivals, casinos and fairs all over the country in support of their latest CD Louder Harder Faster and the 30-year anniversary of their debut album Dirty Rotten Filthy Stinking Rich.

to Elkhorn in 1854. In 1855, the first purchase of land, from Colonel Edward Elderkin, was made consisting of six acres within the Village of Elkhorn limits.

The cost was \$100 an acre with 10% interest, a high price for the time. The city

On Saturday morning at 9 a.m., kids have an opportunity to ride in a combine harvester, courtesy of area farmers who drive their machines to the fairgrounds.

Twice each day there are demonstrations featuring heavy-duty dirt-moving machines - a thriller for kids and many young-atheart adults.

of Elkhorn donated \$300 to fence the land, erect pens and sheds and to dig wells. The fair site has remained in Elkhorn since 1855 on this same location. On April 5, 1965, the Articles of Incorporation for the Walworth County Agricultural Society Inc., were signed by the Secretary of State.

In its early years, many visitors traveled to the fair by train. At one time, there were 19 special trains which arrived daily directly at the fairgrounds and departed again each evening after the harness races. Guests came from Libertyville, Rockford, Freeport, Walworth, Beloit, Madison, Janesville, Milwaukee and Waukesha.

The Walworth County Fairgrounds, throughout history, has been well-regarded as a live entertainment venue. 1933 was the beginning of live entertainment night shows at the Walworth County Fair, such as the WLS entertainers.

Throughout the years, the grandstand main stage has welcomed the talents of such nationally-acclaimed artists, such as Minnie Pearl, Johnny Cash, Keith Urban, Josh Turner, Little Big Town, Styx, Doobie Brothers, Cheap Trick, Foreigner, Skillet, Newsboys United, and The Beach Boys.
